#### A TASTE OF THE NEW CREATION

The story of Jesus turning water into wine is well known. Wedding parties could go on for days, with family and friends dropping in at any time to join in. But something went disastrously awry: the wine ran out. A social faux pas of note! This would never be lived down and would be the talk of the town for years to come. This is when Jesus quietly steps in to rescue the situation, but more than that, to set the tone for his ministry that is going to show us what living as part of the new creation is like.

The amount of water he turned into wine was more than enough to keep the party going for days. Somebody suggested that this represents around 700l of wine. Not only that, but it was the very finest quality. As someone who very much enjoys a glass of good red wine, I would love to have tasted a sample made by the hands of the creator himself.

In some ways, the story pre-figures that great Kingdom banquet at the end of time when God will complete what he has started. It also represents the here and now, the abundance of the new creation in our present lives. Wine itself speaks of the Holy Spirit, the one who comes to make this new creation life a reality within us and our communities. St Paul picks this up when he says in Ephesians: "Do not get drunk with wine, but instead be filled with the Spirit..." and he goes on to speak of music, singing, and grateful hearts. We are invited to participate in this, to respond to Jesus' call to follow him, to allow the wine of the Spirit to fill us afresh today and renew our lives so that God's recreation project will widen and deepen until it embraces the whole world.

#### PROPOSED NEW LIGHTING SCHEME

#### Key new elements:

- a. Nave Pendants to be modified to enhance their appearance and move the shades to be level with the band, reducing the direct glare from the shades. A working prototype to be commissioned. Illumination levels to be zoned along the west-east axis.
- b. Nave Spotlighting to provide directional highlighting for points of focus at the head of the nave, by fitting spotlights to the hanging rods from which the pendants will be suspended.
- c. Transepts Spotlights in positions similar to the existing large metal halide floodlights, to be installed in neat vertical clusters following the rhythm of the wall shafts below the transept clerestory, to include individual points of focus, eg pulpit, lectern, cross above the rood screen.
- d. Aisle Highlights a spotlight, at ceiling level, behind each column to illuminate the aisle wall opposite. The historic door in the north aisle to be illuminated.
- e. The Baptistry and proposed Servery spotlights to highlight, create a general wash and define the areas.
- f. The Chancel and Sanctuary new fittings to light the choir, lectern, Reredos, High Altar and Sanctuary Step.
- g. The Chapel to help bring intimacy and ambience, instal a 24-light Flemish candelabra (as in the vestry)

Important to ensure St Mary's retains the appropriate balance of highlighting, general illumination for safety and the presentation of the architecture of the interior. A control system (dimmable and zoning) to allow simple settings to be created, balanced, and stored. Using "warm white" colour, the natural colours and tone of the interior dressings and finishes to be seen without distorting their true colour. All of the new light sources will be long life, low energy LEDs, the careful use of the lighting control system will provide increased energy saving capability and work towards the 2030 Net Zero Carbon goals.
